





Hearing Unit services include:

- spoken and written language development and enrichment
- speech pathology
- ongoing auditory training
- development of social skills
- development of thinking skills
- development of conversation and public speaking skills
- career counselling, work experience and transition education
- linking students with Hearing Australia and the Cochlear Implant Clinic for regular audiological advice and service
- collaborative development of individual education plans
- parent consultation and regular parent/teacher interviews
- parent information evenings throughout the year
- regular Hearing Unit newsletters
- facilitate transition to school and tertiary education
- access to qualified speech therapist

Hearing Unit students are eligible for enrolment from Early Learning to Year 12.

Application is open to students with a hearing loss.

Entry is dependent on the student's ability to access the curriculum using audition and spoken language as their primary mode of communication. They must also be able to access the classroom curriculum with support from the Hearing Unit teacher.
